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Mr. Dall is a health economist in the Life Sciences division of IHS. He has 20 years' experience conducting research and policy analysis in the areas of health economics, health care delivery, disease cost and management, health promotion, and health workforce. His work applies economic theory, statistical and econometric analysis, cost/benefit analysis, program evaluation, and computer modeling skills.

Mr. Dall has directed numerous workforce studies on physicians, nurses, pharmacists, and other health professions for organizations such as the Bureau of Health Professions (BHPr), Bureau of Primary Care, Office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation, and other federal organizations. Similar studies have been conducted for states, professional associations, and hospital systems and payers. For BHPr, his team has been developing an integrated Health Workforce Simulation Model to model supply and demand for approximately 40 health occupations and 40 medical specialties at the national and state levels. Prior to joining IHS in 2010, Mr. Dall spent 16 years with The Lewin Group conducting a broad array of health workforce and chronic disease studies.

For many years, Mr. Dall has been a U.S. delegate to the International Health Workforce Collaborative and has served on workforce planning committees for Academy Health and the AAMC Workforce Conference. Recent publications have appeared in journals such as *Health Affairs*, *American Journal of Managed Care*, *American Journal of Preventive Medicine*, *American Journal of Health Promotion*, *Diabetes Care*, *Population Health Management*, and *Preventing Chronic Disease*.
